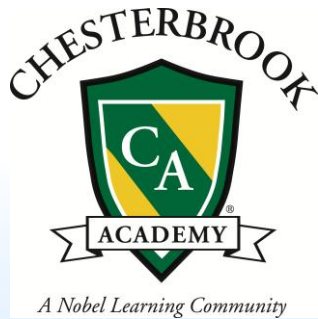

Crafty Campers

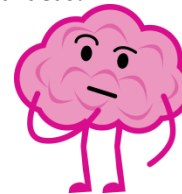
It's time for crazy camp crafts. We let campers express themselves through new experiences such as painting on a real canvas, making beads and jewelry, and so much more.

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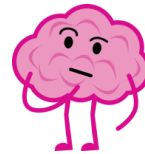
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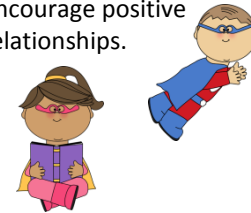
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WEEK 11
