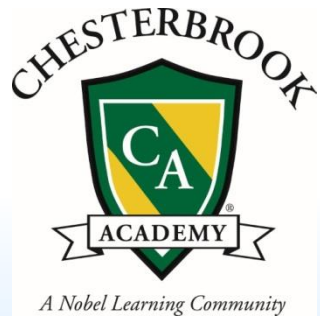

Imagination Station

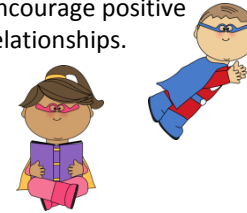
Campers really tap into their brain power by participating in group storytelling sessions as well as dabbling in predictions and engineering projects. Inventions start as wild ideas!
